On 7 September, the new port section in the Pampus Port was inaugurated. This includes a new quay, P10, and an additional 40 000 square metres of yard. The area has been in operation since mid-June, but now was the time to gather employees and customers for an inauguration to mark the milestone in the large port development project.


